

## Letter to Alexander Graham Bell, May 14, 1915

May 14, 1915. Dr. A. G. Bell, 1331 Connecticut Ave., City. Dear Dr. Bell:—

Bell et al. v. Myers — Intf. N o 34,455.

In compliance with your request of the 8th instant, we enclose herewith copy of Myers' preliminary statement which was executed on the 17th day of January, 1914, and which gives his various alleged dates.

Myers has been making strenuous efforts to avoid a requirement of the Rules of the Patent Office with respect to the printing of his record, on the ground that he is too poor to incur the expense, which would be about \$40.00 to \$50.00. He has brought three motions, all of which have been denied, and an appeal will be heard by the Commissioner on the 21st instant. Thereafter we expect that the case will be promptly heard on its merits.
