## PROF. NEWLANDSMITH'S VISIT.

### SUMMER SCHOOL IN NORFOLK.

---

Professor Newlandsmith, who dwells in a far away hermitage on the heights of Mount Carmel in Palestine, is paying a visit to England. His extensive researches into the Ancient Music of the Coptic Church have already been mentioned in these columns, and he has now consented to hold a Summer School on the Norfolk Coast during the first three weeks of August.

In connection with this School, there are to be special services of Musical Devotion at West Runton Parish Church on Tuesdays, at 8.30 p.m.; at Cromer Parish Church on Wednesdays, at 8.30 p.m.; and at Blakeney Parish Church on Fridays, at 5.45 p.m.

These services are to be conducted after the Oratorian Method, with addresses entitled "Thy Kingdom Come." Classes and debates also are to be held in the Concert Room of Runton Hill School, kindly lent by Miss Vernon Harcourt, and in the Ball Room of the Grand Hotel, Cromer.

Prof. Newlandsmith's life is unique; for, although a layman, he has already preached and played his violin in more than 150 of the Parish Churches and Cathedrals of England (with the special sanction of the Archbishop of Canterbury and the principal Diocesan Bishops) as well as in St. George's Cathedral, Jerusalem.
