



"If **Danny Kaye** had not been born," a Hollywood writer once observed, "no one could possibly have invented him."

Kaye is unique among show business headliners. He has been a star of Broadway, the one-man concert stage, night-clubs, motion pictures, television and records (in song and story). In addition, he has found time to be an international ambassador of good will (through his services on behalf of UNICEF), a licensed pilot, an accomplished Chinese chef, honorary member of the American College of Surgery, part owner of the Seattle Mariners baseball team and an acclaimed symphony orchestra conductor of considerable renown.

Kaye is probably the only conductor in the world who cannot read a note of music. He began his podium career in 1954, when he agreed to direct a pension fund concert for the Philadelphia Orchestra. He subsequently conducted benefit concerts with major symphony orchestras all over the world, including an appearance with the BPO and Josef Krips in 1963. He has never accepted a fee for his services and has raised over \$5 million for musicians' pension funds. In 1979, the American

Federation of Musicians presented him with its seldom-awarded Honorary Gold Card Life Membership.

Born David Daniel Kaminsky in Brooklyn, the son of Ukrainian immigrants, Kaye began his career in amateur theater before becoming a Catskill headliner. His first major break came in the late Moss Hart's *Lady in the Dark*, starring Gertrude Lawrence: by rattling off the names of over 50 Russian composers in 38 seconds, he became an overnight sensation.

He progressed to starring roles in motion pictures, further stage appearances and his own highly-rated, award-winning CBS television series, which aired for four years. Throughout his career, Kaye has received numerous awards and citations, from honors granted by heads of state to hand-scrawled letters from children all over the world. In 1965, he was an official representative of UNICEF when the United Nations was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize and he is the only entertainer ever to participate in Nobel Award ceremonies. In 1980 he was decorated with the "Officier de l'ordre des Arts et des Lettres," one of the highest honors the French government can bestow on a foreigner. Kaye won his fifth Emmy Award when he starred in "Look-in at the Met" with Beverly Sills and other members of the Metropolitan Opera. He has also won the prestigious George Foster Peabody Award. On March 29 he will receive the Jean Herscholt Humanitarian Award from the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences.

On October 13, 1981, he made a rare dramatic television appearance, starring in the highly-acclaimed CBS movie-for-television, "Skokie."

Kaye is married to Sylvia Fine, a writer, lyricist and producer of two television specials, "Sylvia Fine Kaye's Musical Comedy Tonight," for which she won many honors, including a Peabody Award. The Kaye's have one daughter, Dena, who is a successful authoress and journalist.
