Some mail has reached us again in tribute to Danny, including a £ 10 donation from England. We have also been informed by Arne Stinus, the Executive Secretary of the Danish Committee for UNICEF that a private Danish Art Museum in North Jutland will contribute D.Kr. 100,000 (appr. \$ 15,000) to UNICEF as Danny Kaye Memorial Fund. We hope to receive more details soon.

We have now requested the ECOSOC Chamber for the Memorial Ceremony to take place on Tuesday, Sept. 22, between 6 and 7 pm. Since I will be on travel during the next two weeks, my assistant Eileen O'Connor will follow up and contact you when necessary. Her telephone number is (212) 415-8243.

Concerning the "Birthday Celebration" on 18 January, we have requested our European Office to explore with different European Committees the possibilities for making this a major event. The Committees will be meeting the end of the month and we should receive some responses then. Similarly we hope to hear from Australia and Canada. Naturally we will communicate to you any suggestions as soon as we receive them and look forward to your advice and help.


If not too late, maybe you could have the sculpture shipped directly to the place where the reproductions will be made:

Re: Quotation on bronze castings

Dear Horst,

As per my conversation on Friday with Richard Mauro, I have enclosed a contract for the reproduction in bronze of the portrait head of Danny Kaye. As I discussed with Richard this will require making a one-time permanent rubber mold which will last for a number of years should any future bronze castings be desired.

At separate cost per casting I can make either one or two heads at this time or any more desired in the future. As per the black marble or onyx bases I will charge whatever my cost will be plus \$ 20.00 per base for acquiring the base and drilling and mounting the sculpture on the bases. Usually a base of this size would cost approximately \$ 80.00.

If you find this agreeable and come to a decision on the number of castings please sign and return one copy of the contract to me.

I would anticipate it would take approximately 6 weeks to complete one or two castings from the time I receive the original bronze. I would also order the bases necessary as soon as I have a commitment.
