Mr. JAVITS (for himself, Mr. KEATING, Mr. KUCHEL, Mr. ENGLE, Mr. CHURCH, Mr. HUMPHREY, Mr. SYMINGTON, and Mr. LONG of Missouri) introduced the following joint resolution; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Banking and Currency

JOINT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the issuance of a gold medal to Danny Kaye.

Whereas Danny Kaye, as an internationally famous entertainer, has given to the American people and to the world many treasured moments; and has given his time, talent, and energy unstintingly and unselfishly to humanitarian causes; and

Whereas he has served as "Ambassador at Large" for the United Nation's Children's Fund, one of the greatest lifesaving and lifegiving agencies in modern history; and has traveled more than one hundred and twenty-five thousand miles in seventeen countries in Asia, the Middle East, Europe, and Africa, to bring cheer to the children of the world and to promote the objectives of United Nations Children's Fund; and

Whereas in these travels Danny Kaye has proved that language is no barrier to a better understanding of the peoples of the world; and has reported through film and television on the conditions of children aided by United Nation's Children's Fund; and these films have been seen by more than one hundred and forty-five million viewers in twenty-eight languages and have won many awards throughout the world; and

Whereas Danny Kaye has been honored for his humanitarian work throughout the world; and has rendered his country outstanding service as an effective ambassador of good will for America; and also continues his work on behalf of the United Service Organization, entertaining American servicemen all over the world, as he did in World War II and the Korean conflict: Therefore be it
