DANNY KAYE TO RECEIVE LIONS INTERNATIONAL HUMANITARIAN AWARD

OAK BROOK, IL. -- Entertainer Danny Kaye's service to the needy and underprivileged people of the world will be given special recognition July 4 in San Francisco. He will be presented with the Humanitarian Award, highest honor bestowed by the International Association of Lions Clubs.

For more than 20 years, Kaye has given countless benefit programs on behalf of the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF). In 1965, he served as UNICEF's representative when the organization was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.

Kaye's concern for the welfare of children parallels the worldwide efforts of Lions International, an organization conceived and dedicated to serve the underprivileged of the world.

Presentation of the Humanitarian Award to Kaye will take place during the Association's 57th Annual Convention. Lions International President Tris Coffin of Montreal, Quebec, Canada, will present the award. More than 40,000 people, including Lions members and their families, are expected to attend the convention.

Lions International is the world's largest service club organization with more than one million members. There are 27,000 Lions clubs operating in 146 nations and geographical areas of the world.
